THE TRUTH ABOUT CULTURAL DANGERS

The truth is that...

- There is something dark inside all of us that <u>DRIFTS</u> toward <u>DANGER</u>. (Genesis 13:1-12, 19:1, Jeremiah 17:9-10)
- None of us plan to <u>WRECK</u> our lives. A guardrail is a plan <u>NOT</u> to wreck our lives. (Genesis 19:8,26, Ephesians 5:15-18)

WHY HAVE FAMILY GUARDRAILS/VALUES?

Family guardrails are important because they...

- <u>FLOW</u> out of <u>RELATIONSHIP</u> with GOD. (Titus 2:11)
- <u>DIRECT</u> away & <u>PROTECT</u> from DANGER. (Titus 2:12)
- **S** <u>KEEP me HOLY</u> for GOD. (Titus 2:13-14)
