- **3** IT'S NOT JUST SOMETHING YOU <u>THINK.</u> (James 2:18)
- **4** IT'S NOT JUST SOMETHING YOU <u>BELIEVE</u>. (James 2:19)
- **§** IT'S SOMETHING YOU <u>DO.</u> (James 2:20-26)
